

Community Volunteer (Wales)

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At Crimestoppers, we believe that it is **people** who stop crime.



Each and every one of us can play a part. Together, we can be safer from crime. Our volunteers play a vital role for our charity.

Our volunteers connect people everywhere with the belief they can stop crime. Volunteers usually work as part of a local team, in a role that suits your skills and/ or experiences.

Role overview:

This role is suited to someone who is already a visible, active and trusted part of their local community. You may already be connected to local groups, organisations or residents, and understand how best to engage people in a way that feels relevant and credible.

As a Community Volunteer, you will use your local insight, relationships and initiative to help grow awareness of Crimestoppers in your area. This role offers a high level of autonomy, while working directly with and being supported by the Regional Manager.

Role purpose:

As a Community Volunteer, you will act as a local representative for Crimestoppers, helping to build awareness, strengthen community connections and encourage confidence in anonymous reporting.

We are looking for someone who is already part of their community and can use their existing networks, knowledge and judgement to identify opportunities, build relationships and support our mission locally.

You will report directly to the Regional Manager, while having the flexibility to work independently and shape activity in a way that best reflects your community.

Key responsibilities:

- Represent and promote Crimestoppers within your local community
- Use your existing local contacts and relationships to support community engagement

- Identify opportunities to raise awareness through local groups, events and networks
- Build and maintain positive relationships with community stakeholders
- Work independently to develop ideas and local activity that align with Crimestoppers' aims
- Share local insight, feedback and opportunities with the Regional Manager
- Support campaigns, engagement activity and outreach where appropriate
- Help strengthen trust and awareness of the anonymous reporting service in your area

Skills and experience:

- Already active, known or connected within your local community
- A trusted and credible presence, with good local awareness
- Confidence building relationships and engaging a wide range of people
- Ability to work independently and use your own initiative
- Communication and interpersonal skills
- Commitment to the mission and values of Crimestoppers
- Previous community engagement, volunteering or outreach experience would be helpful

Commitment:

This is a flexible volunteer role that can work around your availability. Activity may vary depending on local opportunities, relationships and events.

Training and support:

You will receive appropriate training and ongoing support from Crimestoppers. The role reports directly to the Regional Manager, who will provide guidance while allowing you the autonomy to take a locally informed approach.

Reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred during volunteering will be reimbursed.

Benefits of volunteering:

Volunteering can build confidence and wellbeing, while offering a strong sense of purpose and connection. As a Community Volunteer, you can use your existing strengths and community presence to make a meaningful difference.
